

Grand Junction, Colorado
March 14, 1918

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vedder, Vorbeck, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Blackstone.

The bill of the Castell Lumber Co. for \$182.82 (#25,718) for lumber and cement, having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the same be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the Water Fund for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and the bill allowed.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the following resolution be passed and adopted.

Resolution.

Whereas

The water meter at the Sugar Factory is out of order and not registering, and under the provisions of Ord. #255 charges should be made based according to previous readings when meter was registering, and

Whereas

In the month of February 1918 the sugar campaign ended on the 6th. Be it therefore

Resolved

That the first six days of Feb. 1918 be proportioned on basis of previous reading, and the last twenty two days of Feb. and also future accounts for spring and summer until said meter is again in repair be based on a proportion of readings for period from Feb. 1st. 1917 to Sept. 1st. 1917.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council adjourned.
