

Grand Junction, Colorado
April 9, 1918

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioners Vedder and Vorbeck.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 2 were read and approved.

A communication from John G. McKinney, county treasurer, in reference to tax sale certificates Nos. 19,467 and 19,468, was read.

The following resolution was thereupon introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

Whereas, through mistake J. B. LaMunyon paid water main tax on Lots not his own, intending to pay on lots 7 and 8, Block 30, in the city of Grand Junction, the said lots being sold and certificates Nos. 19,467 and 19,468 being issued on said sale; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be and he is hereby authorized and instructed to assign the two said certificates to Mr. La Munyon for the original amount of the assessment.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The quarterly report of the Judge of the Municipal Court was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following bills having been examined and approved by heads of departments and audited, were read by the Clerk:

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

The Canon Block Investment Co. made application for building permit to erect a third story on the Electric building.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the application was referred to the Mayor.

On motion of Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
