

Grand Junction, Colorado
June 18, 1918

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present:
Cherrington, Vedder, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 11th were read and approved.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Requiring all Able-bodied Male Persons in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, between the Ages of 18 and 55 Years to Engage in Some Useful Employment, Occupation, Business, Trade or Profession during the Crisis Resulting from the Present War," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance, and ordered published, and that it be numbered 271.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance and numbered 271.

The bond of J. W. Rader, master plumber, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The bid of the Book Cliff Company for furnishing the city with coal for the season of 1918-19 was received and read, being as follows: For nut lump, \$4.50 per ton; for nut run, \$2.70 per ton.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be instructed to order for the City buildings and plants the required amount of Book Cliff coal of nut lump and nut run for the season of 1918-19.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be instructed to order for the Water department the following:

700 ft. 12-inch sheet metal rivited pipe at \$1.75 per foot.
3-22 per cent. bends at \$10.50
2-45 per cent bends at \$12.00
1-L at \$14.50

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to invest \$1,000.00 of the funds of the Water Sinking Fund in Grand Junction Public Improvement Bonds.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the house at Lincoln Park be ordered painted by the keeper of the park.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, no.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned.
