The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication from L. A. Barley, engineer of the Rocky Mountain Fire Under writers' Association, in reference to the improvement of the general fire fighting apparatus of the city, was read.

A communication from Julius Pearse Fire Dept. Supply Co., quoting price on the American La-France Fire Truck, was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from C. H. Fulton in reference to auditing city's books and accounts was read and ordered filed.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Daily Sentinel be designated as the official newspaper of the City on and after July 1, 1918.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the city offices be closed at 12 o'clock m. on Saturdays during the months of July and August.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned.
