

Grand Junction, Colorado
July 30, 1918

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present:
Cherrington, Vedder, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 23d were read and approved.

Mrs. Gover Rice appeared before the Council in behalf of the Woman's Council of Defense and spoke in reference to the establishment of a local municipal market for the sale of fruits.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Council go on record as willing to back the Woman's Council of Defense in the matter of the establishment of a municipal market.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the report was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.
