A communication from the B. M. Petroleum Co., in reference to the erection of oil and gasoline storage tanks on South Seventh street, was read.

It was thereupon moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the B. M. Petroleum Co. be permitted to erect oil and gasoline storage tanks on tract of land south of South Seventh street, provided the said company comply with the city ordinances.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The report of the audit of the City's books and accounts for the first half of the current fiscal year by C. H. Fulton, certified public accountant, was received and read. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Mayor be instructed to have the Police and Fire Department watch the street lights and see that they are turned on, according to ordinance, at sunset, and not turned off before sunrise.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
