

Grand Junction, Colorado  
September 10, 1918

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present:  
Cherrington, Vedder, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of September 3d were read and approved.

Mr. Wm. Weiser, chairman of the Mesa County Liberty Loan Committee, appeared before the Council in reference to the next Liberty Loan drive and asked for financial aid from the City to help carry on the next drive.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the Council appropriate \$75.00 of the City's funds for the purpose of carrying on the fourth Liberty Loan campaign.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

A communication from the manager of the State Compensation Insurance Fund, with bill for premium, was read.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Treasurer's Certificate No. 20,110 was issued to the City of Grand Junction on sale of certain real estate for delinquent Sidewalk District No. 5 assessment, said sale being made through error of the County Treasurer, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the said certificate be assigned to the owner of the real estate for cancellation on payment by him of the face value of the certificate without interest thereon.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
