

Grand Junction, Colorado
September 25, 1918

Pursuant to adjournment, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened at 10 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present:
Cherrington, Vedder, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the offer of the City to supply the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company with water at the Durham stock yards as appearing in the minutes of the Council meeting held January 18, 1916, be re-affirmed; provided, that the tank at Durham be filled between the hours of 10 o'clock p.m. and 5 o'clock a.m., and that the water for the said yards be used from the tank.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
