Grand Junction, Colorado November 2, 1918

All the Commissioners having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at 3 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vedder, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

The petition of L. O. Marshall and other residents of the West Side, asking the Council to quarantine all households afflicted with the Spanish Influenza, was presented and read.

After some discussion of the matter of the petition, the Council, upon the advice of Dr. Carl W. Plumb, City Health Officer, did not deem it advisable to take action in the matter of quarantining houses of influenza patients, at present.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council adjourned.
