

Grand Junction, Colorado  
December 12, 1918

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present:  
Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the all-wise God has called from this earthly life to the unknown world beyond the grave our fellow Commissioner, Bostwick W. Vedder; therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, that in the death of Commissioner Vedder this Council has lost an honored and beloved member and the City a faithful and efficient public servant; and be it

RESOLVED, that this Council extend to the bereaved wife and other members of the family our sincere sympathy in this their hour of sorrow and bereavement.

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be instructed to send a copy of these resolutions to the widow of the deceased.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Reports on the Prevalence of Spanish Influenza and Pneumonia in the City of Grand Junction," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance and that it be numbered 275, and be ordered published in the official newspaper of the City.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the ordinance passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance and numbered 275.

Dr. Carl W. Plumb, city health officer, appeared before the Council and made a verbal report on the number of Spanish Influenza cases now in the city.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
