Grand Junction, Colorado December 21, 1918

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 10 o'clock a.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the epidemic of Spanish Influenza is still prevalent in the city, though the situation is somewhat improved, and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to keep the epidemic well under control, and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the City Council dances are especially hazardous and more likely to spread the disease than any other social function; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, that all dances, public or private, shall not be permitted in this city until further notice.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

The official bond of Charles Garber, as Commissioner of Water and Sewers, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the same be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
