

Grand Junction, Colorado  
December 24, 1918

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present:  
Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg.

Charles Garber having taken the oath of office before a notary public and his official bond having been accepted by the Council, now took his seat in the Council as Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 17 and adjourned session of December 21 were read and approved.

Mrs. Morse, Mrs. Smith and other ladies appeared before the Council and presented the matter of the relation of the Public Rest Room to the Community welfare, and asked the Council to reconsider its action in reference to the discontinuance of the payment of part of the rental by the City of the rest room.

No action was taken, but the Council agreed to take up the matter at some future meeting.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Levying a Special Assessment on Certain Real Estate of Grand Junction for Benefits Conferred by the Water System of Said City," was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Levying a Special Assessment on Certain Real Estate of Grand Junction for Benefits Conferred by the Water System of said City," be passed and adopted and that it be numbered 276.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and the ordinance passed and adopted and numbered 276.

The labor account of the Department of Health and Civic Beauty (27,140-141) for \$51.00, having been approved by the Commissioner of that department, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the same be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the  
labor account allowed.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the  
Council adjourned.
