

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 7, 1919.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Vorbeck.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 31, 1918, and adjourned session of January 2, 1919, were read and approved.

C. Bowers, chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, appeared before the Council and stated that the road on Purdy Mesa had been finished to the Kannah Creek Intake and had been officially accepted as a county road.

The following resolution was thereupon introduced and read:

#### RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the City Council, on January 2, 1917, agreed to pay the sum of \$350.00 towards fencing a public county road on Purdy Mesa to the Kannah Creek Intake, when the said road has been built to the Intake and accepted as a county road, and

WHEREAS, it appears that said road has been built to the Intake and accepted by the Board of County Commissioners as a county road; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that warrants be ordered issued for \$350.00; one for \$175.00 on the General fund, and one for \$175.00 on the Water fund, payable to I. H. Davison, as agreed by the Council by resolution passed January 2, 1917.

Moved by Commissioner Cherrington, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

The official bond of Dr. Carl W. Plumb, City Health Officer, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was accepted and placed on file.

The annual report of the Chief of the Fire Department was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the City Clerk and Auditor was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The following bills having been examined and approved by heads of departments and audited, were read by the Clerk:
