

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 14, 1919.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 7th were read and approved.

The following reports were submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, were referred to the auditor:

Quarterly Report of the City Treasurer,

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, and

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Highways.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The annual report of the City Health Officer was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The depository bond of the Grand Valley National Bank having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was on motion

of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Garber, accepted and placed on file.

Messrs. A. R. Sampliner and D. W. Aupperle, representing the Chamber of Commerce and G. V. Water Users' Association, appeared before the Council and asked that the Mayor be sent to Denver to represent the City at conference of various State interests.

It was thereupon moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Mayor be sent to Denver to represent the City at the various Good Reads, Land Colonization and County Division meetings to be held in that city next week.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Council appropriate \$125.00 out of the General Fund to pay balance of indebtedness incurred by Civilians' "Flue" office, provided the County of Mesa appropriate a like amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Garber, the Council adjourned.
