

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 28, 1919.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 21 were read and approved.

The depository bond of the Bank of Grand Junction having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following reports having been examined and approved by the Auditor and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the same be accepted and ordered filed and that the annual reports be ordered published:

The Annual Report of the City Clerk and Auditor was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the Clerk be instructed to have 2,000 copies of the Annual Reports of the Commissioners printed in pamphlet form.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follow Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Garber, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty be authorized and instructed to expend \$100.00 in the purchase of street shade trees for free distribution among city residents.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.
