

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 11, 1919.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 4th were read and approved.

A communication from the Mayor of the City of Fort Collins, asking endorsement of a certain bill pending in the State Legislature in reference to apportioning the county road fund, was read, and the Clerk was instructed to answer same.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order 825 ft. of Byer's Genuine W. I. Galvanized pipe and 15 tees, ells and crosses, and 12 silcocks, for Riverside Park.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The bonds of John A. Dixon, George W. Fletcher, and John Fuite, master plumbers, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by

Commissioner Garber, that the same be accepted and ordered placed on file, and that plumber licenses be granted to the said applicants.

The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the City purchase the 40 acres, more or less, of land adjoining the city reservoirs, new owned by J. H. Rankin et. al, for not to exceed \$550.00.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, no; Garber, no; Holmburg, yea.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
