Grand Junction, Colorado, April 22, 1919.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Highways has recommended to the Council that a cement sidewalk be ordered constructed in front of the lots hereafter described, and

WHEREAS, the Council deems that the construction of the sidewalk is necessary; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a cement sidewalk be and hereby is ordered constructed in accordance with the provisions of the city ordinances in front of the following described lots, namely: Lots 29, 30, 31 and 32, Block H, in Keith's Addition to the City of Grand Junction.

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be and hereby is authorized and instructed to notify the owners of the above described lots to construct a cement sidewalk on the south side of said described lots within thirty days after receipt of said notice.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted,

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea; the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the auditor.

The following bills having been examined and approved by heads of departments and audited, were read by the Clerk:

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Licensing of Second-hand Stores," was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the proposed ordinance be amended as follows: that Section 3 thereof be amended by changing the last word of the seventh line, in the printed ordinance, from "ten" to "five;" and Section 4, by changing in the fifth line the word "twenty-one" to "eighteen;" and Section 1, by changing the license fee from \$10.00 to \$5.00.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the amendments adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as amended be passed and adopted and that it be numbered 280.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the ordinance passed and adopted and numbered 280.

A communication from the Public Library Board, with resolution passed by said Board in reference to exhange of property between the City and County and the School District, was read.

The communication was ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase one steel drum of Cleno, at \$2.00 per gallon.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
