

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 13, 1919.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 6th were read and approved.

The bill of H. M. McDowell for \$68.50 (#27,878) for expenses incurred in the Victory Liberty Loan Drive, having been approved by the Commissioner of Public Affairs, it was moved by Commissioner Garber, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the same be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the General Fund for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea. All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bill allowed.

A communication from the City Attorney in reference to increase in telephone rates ordered by the Postmaster General, was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication from the State Industrial Commission was read and referred to the City Clerk.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the report was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
