

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 20, 1919.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 13 were read and approved.

Wm. Murr and others appeared before the Council in reference to the continued backing up of sewage in District No. 1, and asked that steps be taken to relieve the situation. The Mayor appointed Commissioners Garber and Vorbeck to make investigation in the matter and report to the Council at the next regular meeting.

A communication from C. H. Fulton, submitting bid for auditing city's books and accounts, was read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, the communication was laid on the table.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The official bond of Andrew L. Halligan, Night Policeman, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The report of the audit of the city's books and accounts by C. H. Fulton, certified public accountant, was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.
