

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 22, 1919.

All the Commissioners having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at 2 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

City Health Officer Carl W. Plumb was present and made a statement in reference to the scarlet fever epidemic.

After some discussion as to the best method of preventing the spread of the epidemic, the following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, an epidemic of scarlet fever is prevalent in the City of Grand Junction, and

WHEREAS, the City Council is advised by the City Health Officer that the disease is liable to spread with deadly effects unless some action is taken to prevent the spread of the disease, and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Health Officer that the disease has spread largely through the public schools by children with mild and unreported cases having attended school; therefore, be it

Resolved, that the City Council request the School Board of District No. 1 to close the school term of all the grades below the Eighth grade on the 29th day of May, 1919.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the water rental on the property at 1024 Main street be remitted for the balance of the Second quarter on account of damage done by reason of water having been turned on before ordered.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
