

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 3, 1919.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 27 were read and approved.

A communication from the Secretary of the School Board with reference to the closing of the public schools on account of the scarlet fever epidemic was presented and read. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A petition from the members of the Fire Department, with supplementary petition of business and professional men, asking for an increase in salaries, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the petition was laid on the table.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order for the Water Department one 35-ton carload of 6-inch, class C, cast iron pipe.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the same was referred to the Mayor.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Clerk be requested to write to the following cities and inquire what salaries are paid to the members of their police and fire departments: La Junta, Leadville, Greeley, Ft. Collins, Boulder and Loveland.

The motion carried.
