

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 10, 1919.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 3d were read and approved.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following reports having been examined and approved by the Auditor and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, the same were on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file:

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs,

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers,

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Highways,

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty,

Quarterly Report of the City Treasurer,

Quarterly Report of the City Clerk and Auditor, and

Quarterly Report of the Judge of the Municipal Court.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for an Emergency Appropriation for the Maintenance and Care of the Public Parks," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance to Protect the Public Health and to Prevent and Restrain Venereal Diseases in the City of Grand Junction," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance and be ordered published and numbered 282.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the proposed ordinance passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance and numbered 282.

The Labor Account of the Department of Health and Civic Beauty for \$75.00 (No. 28,043-45) having been approved by the Commissioner, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the same be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the labor account allowed.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that \$4,000.00 be transferred from the Water Fund to the Water Sinking Fund, and that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to take up \$10,000.00 of the water bonds maturing July 1, 1929, and optional July 1, 1919.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
