

Grand Junction, Colorado  
August 5, 1919

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 29th were read and approved.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The quarterly reports of the Commissioner of Water and Swers and the Commissioner of Highways were submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Garber, the reports were referred to the Auditor.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the pool and cigarette license issued to Sixte Fernandez Co. be transferred to Antone Coscorosa, the said Coscorosa having purchased the business of the said Fernandez Co.

The motion being put, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase for the Water Department one ton of pig lead and 6 patch sleeves.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase the necessary lumber for the repair of the grand stand, bleachers and exhibition hall in Lincoln Park.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for an Emergency Appropriation for the Maintenance of the Health Department," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Providing for an Emergency Appropriation for the Maintenance of the Health Department," be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance and that it be numbered 285.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the ordinance passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance and numbered 285.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that Capt. J. J. Vandemoer be appointed City Engineer.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and Capt. J. J. Vandemoer duly appointed as City Engineer.
