

Grand Junction, Colorado
August 19, 1919

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 12 were read and approved.

The report of the semi-annual audit of the City's books and accounts by J. E. Ragan was submitted and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication from E. T. Comegys in reference to sale of government subsistence stores was read. The communication was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

A communication from Wallace-Tiernan Co. in reference to chlorination of water was read and referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

Communications from the Juanita Sales Co. and the Book Cliff Coal Co., submitting bids for furnishing coal to the city, were read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be

authorized and instructed to purchase for the use of the city departments lump coal for the season from the Juanita Sales Co. at \$6.20 per ton.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.
