Grand Junction, Colorado August 23, 1919

All the Commissioners having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at one o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase 5,000 pounds of bacon in crates and 200 pounds of prunes from the U. S. government at Omaha, Neb., to be sold at cost to the people of Grand Junction and vicinity.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Mayor Cherrington recommended to the Council that an arc light be ordered placed at the corner of Ute avenue and Tenth street.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the recommendations of the Mayor be concurred in and that an arc light be ordered placed at the intersection of Ute avenue and Tenth street.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea. All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned.
