

Grand Junction, Colorado
September 5, 1919

Pursuant to adjournment, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met at two o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners responded as present at roll call: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Garber.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, because of the prevalence of influenza and scarlet fever in the city of Grand Junction and vicinity during the past 12 months and the possible recurrence of either or both, and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that a nurse be employed to guard the health of children in school and citizens generally in the hopes of preventing in the future a recurrence of said diseases, and

WHEREAS, the school is willing and anxious to employ a nurse for the said purpose and has funds to pay her expenses for the next six months, but lacks funds to pay her during the last three months of the present school year, and

WHEREAS, the life of the present Council expires in November next and this Council cannot enter into a contract binding the next Council; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the present Council does declare itself in favor of employing a nurse for the said purpose, the wages to be paid for the first six months by the School Board of District No. 1 and for the last three months by the City, and this Council does urgently recommend to the succeeding Council that it pay a nurse for the three months as aforesaid.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Cherrington, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that if the water rentals of the Oasis Mutual Water Co. and of the green house of J. W. Watson be not paid in full on or before the 15th of September, the Commissioner of Water and

Sewers be instructed to turn off the water from the mains, and that notices be sent forthwith to these consumers to this effect. The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners present.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned.
