

Grand Junction, Colorado
September 23, 1919

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of September 16 were read and approved.

A communication from C. E. Leverich, superintendent Rio Grande Junction Railway, in reference to request of City to construct cinder walk across tracks on Main street, was read. The communication was ordered filed.

The official bond of John J. Vandemoer, City Engineer, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following bills having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Public Affairs and audited, were read by the Clerk:

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the City Engineer be instructed to make a preliminary survey of the proposed Riverside Drive from the Fifth street bridge to the Main street bridge.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, secnded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
