## Grand Junction, Colorado October 9, 1919

Pursuant to adjournment, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction met at 9 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

The following Commissioners were present at roll call: Cherrington, Blackstone, Garber, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Vorbeck.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the present sewer outlets of Districts Nos. 1, 2 and 4 are unsanitary and a menace to the health of the city, and

WHEREAS, the outlets of Districts Nos. 1 and 2 are inadequate in size; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that it is the sense of this Council that an intercepting sewer district should be organized to carry the sewage of said Districts Nos. 1, 2 4, and that it be constructed large enough to take care of all possible growth of the city within the said three districts.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Blackstone, yea; Garber, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Garber, the Council adjourned.
