

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 20, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Commissioner Garber, acting Mayor, in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Cherrington.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 13 were read and approved.

Bids for furnishing lumber and other supplies for the new sewer districts were opened and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the bids were referred to the City Engineer and the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

A communication from S. O. Harper in reference to renting of trenching machine to the city for sewer work was read.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the City Attorney be instructed to draw up contract with the U. S. Reclamation Service, in conjunction with Project Engineer Harper, for use by the City of the Austin trenching machine along lines indicated in the letter of Mr. Harper.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners present.

The official bonds of Henry Tupper, City Attorney, and T. E. Thompson, City Engineer, were presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, that the official bonds of Mr. Tupper and Mr. Thompson be accepted and placed on file.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bonds accepted.

The bond of J. W. Rader, master plumber, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, that the bond be accepted and filed and license granted to the said Rader.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Salaries," was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, that the proposed ordinance be amended by striking out the words "on and after January 1, 1920," in Section 1 thereof.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the amendment adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, that the proposed ordinance as amended be passed and adopted and numbered 290.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the ordinance passed and adopted and numbered 290.

The following reports were submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same were referred to the Clerk and Auditor: Quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways, and quarterly report of the City Treasurer.

The annual report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg,

seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The following bills having been examined and approved by heads of departments and audited, were read by the Clerk:
