

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 27, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Commissioner Garber, acting Mayor, in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Garber, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioners Cherrington and Whittaker.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 20th were read and approved.

The labor account of the Department of Public Affairs for \$280.00 (#29,291-93) for wages of Firemen having been approved by the acting Mayor, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the same be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the amount on the Fire fund.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the labor account allowed.

The bond of J. A. Dixon, master plumber, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the same be accepted and filed, and the license granted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned until Friday, January 30, at four o'clock p. m.
