Grand Junction, Colorado, January 31, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 9 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Commissioner Garber, acting Mayor, in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Cherrington,

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The Council proceeded to consider the bids for the bonds of Sewer Districts Nos. 5 and 6.

It being found that the bid of Sidle, Simons, Fels & Co. was the highest and best bid, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, that the bid of Sidle, Simons, Fels & Co. for the bonds of Sewer District No. 5 and Intercepting Sewer District No. 6 be accepted, the said being as follows: For the bonds of Intercepting Sewer District No. 6, at the rate of \$1,003.15 for each one thousand dollar bond, and at the rate of \$983.30 for each one thousand dollar bond of the bonds of Sewer District No. 5; the purchaser to furnish the blank bonds free of charge and to pay accrued interest from date of issue to date of delivery; the City to have the right, at its option, to receive as part pay certificates of indebtedness drawing five per cent interest, payable on demand, from such purchaser for such part of the funds as may not be needed in construction work; and that the acting Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and instructed to enter into a contract with said firm of Sidle, Simons, Fels & Co. for the sale of said bonds.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned. /s/ Charles K. Holmburg
