

Grand Junction, February 10, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Commissioner Garber, acting Mayor, in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Cherrington.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 3d were read and approved.

The annual report of the Commissioner of Highways was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the same was referred to the Clerk and Auditor.

The following reports having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies and the Clerk and Auditor, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the same be accepted and ordered placed on file:

Quarterly Report of the City Clerk and Auditor,

Quarterly Report of the City Treasurer,

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty,

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers,

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Highways,

Annual Report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty,

Annual Report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The motion carried and the reports were ordered filed.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty be authorized and instructed to expend \$150.00, more or less, in the purchase of shade trees by the City for general distribution.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the acting Mayor and Clerk be authorized and instructed to sign on behalf of the City the contract with A. O. Shaff for the collection and disposal of the city's garbage.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

A proposed contract with the U. S. Reclamation Service for the use by the City of its trenching machine was read.

The following resolution was thereupon introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City of Grand Junction to secure the services of the trenching machine for the large tile of Sewer Districts Nos. 5 and 6, and

WHEREAS, the services of a trencher can be secured from the U. S. government; be it therefore

RESOLVED, that the contract just read be entered into with the U. S. government, and the acting Mayor and City Clerk be hereby authorized and instructed to execute the same on behalf of the City of Grand Junction.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, the Council adjourned.
