

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 24, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 17 were read and approved.

The following reports having been examined and approved by the Clerk and Auditor and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the same be accepted and placed on file:

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs,
Annual Report of the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies,
Annual Report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs, and
Annual Report of the Clerk and Auditor.

The motion carried and the reports were ordered filed.

The resignation of C. D. Hatcher, night policeman, was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, the resignation was accepted.

The following bills having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Public Affairs and audited, were read by the Clerk:

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

The monthly report of the City Weigher for December having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was accepted and ordered filed.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the resolution passed and adopted January 1920, creating Intercepting Sewer District No. 6, fixed the bonds to be issued for said district at \$250.00 each, and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to increase the denomination of said bonds from \$250.00 to \$500.00; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the bonds of said district be and the same are hereby fixed at five hundred dollars each, instead of \$250.00 each as in said resolution provided.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
