

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 9, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Commissioner Garber, acting Mayor, in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Cherrington,

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of March 2d were read and approved.

The special committee appointed to look into the matter of the application of J. W. Milne for permission to enclose shed on west side of his building on Colorado avenue with frame work or corrugated iron, reported adversely on granting such permit.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Amending Section 3 of Ordinance No. 167, passed and adopted August 24, 1909," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the City Engineer be instructed to make a preliminary survey of certain streets in the proposed paving district to determine if there is sufficient drainage or if storm sewers will be necessary in case such streets are paved.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
