The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, that the report be accepted and placed on file, and that the Council, with two experienced builders, examine the several premises mentioned in the report.

The motion carried.

The quarterly reports of the Judge of the Municipal Court and the quarterly report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs were submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the reports were received and referred to the Clerk and Auditor.

The monthly reports.

The reports of the City Weigher for the months of January, February and March having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same were accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers be instructed to immediately take out the water meter at the Sugar Factory and have same repaired.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners present.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
