

Grand Junction, Colorado, April 27, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 20th were read and approved.

A communication from the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Mfg. Co. in reference to the installation of lights in Whitman Park was read and received.

The quarterly report of the City Clerk and Auditor having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers was submitted and read and referred to the Clerk and Auditor.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase one barrel of roof paint for the City Hall.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The bond of Clarence M. Corder, master plumber, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the bond be accepted and filed and a plumbers' license granted to the said Corder.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Garber, the Council adjourned.
