

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 4, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 27 were read and approved.

Mrs. Jones of the O. M. Mesa Cemetery Association appeared before the Council and asked for financial assistance from the City for the maintenance of the cemeteries for the current year.

Moved by Commissioner Garber, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Council appropriate \$100.00 out of the Contingent Fund for the care and maintenance of the Orchard Mesa Cemeteries for the year 1920.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone; yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read and referred to the Mayor.

A proposed agreement with the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company for permit to construct a sewer pipe line across the right-of-way of the said railroad company was submitted and read:

The following resolution was thereupon introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the license covering use of the Station grounds for sewer pipe line across the station grounds and under the tracks of the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company, in form as just read and attached hereto, bearing date of the 29th day of April, A. D. 1920, be entered into by the City of Grand Junction, and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute said license on behalf of said City, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized to attest same and affix the seal of the City thereto.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington yea; Garber yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the City Engineer be instructed to prepare a map of the City showing location, size and depth of water mains, together with valves, fire plugs and curb stops; also location of sewer lines, size and depth of same and location of manholes and flush-holes, also showing street and alley grades.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the City purchase one Hoover vacuum cleaner for use in the City Hall and Fire House.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the City Clerk be authorized and instructed to offer one cent per pound for dandelion roots brought to the City Fire House on or before May 29, 1920, and that a prize of \$5.00 be given to the boy or girl under 15 years of age bringing the largest number of pounds of such roots, and a prize of \$2.50 for the second largest number of pounds and a prize of \$1.00 for the third largest number of pounds of such roots on or before said date; such roots to be dug within the city limits and to be free from dirt.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.
