

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 18, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the special meeting of May 9th and regular meeting of May 11th were read and approved.

Mr. Edward Rose appeared before the Council and asked for \$25.00 for damages done to his orchard on West avenue by the City in the construction of sewer line in Districts Nos. 5 and 6.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Mayor appointed Commissioners Blackstone and Holmburg and City Attorney Tupper as a committee to investigate the matter of the damage claimed by Mr. Rose.

The petition of R. G. Miller and others, asking Council to amend ordinance in reference to paving intersections of streets, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the petition was laid on the table until next regular meeting.

A communication from the State Compensation Insurance Fund, with bill for premium for insurance for year ending June 30, 1920, was read.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone the report was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Clerk be requested to notify the School Board of District No. 1 that the Athletic Association of the High School will not be permitted to held any more track meets or races at Lincoln Park without first obtaining permit to do so and paying up in full for races or meets held in said park prior to this date.

The motion carried by unanimous vote of the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the flag pole at the intersection of Seventh and Main streets be ordered removed when said intersection is paved.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.
