A communication from the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Mfg. Co., stating that an are light had been placed at the intersection of Ute avenue and Tenth street, was read; also a communication from R. E. Tope, Principal of the Grand Junction schools, in reference to the proposed summer juvenile program and the work of the school and community nurse the past year.

Both communications were ordered filed.

The bill of the Biggs-Kurtz Hardware Co. for \$331.78 (#30,296) having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, that the same be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on Sewer District No. 6 Fund for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bill allowed.

The following reports having been examined and approved by the Clerk and Auditor and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, that the same be accepted and ordered placed on file:

Quarterly Report of the Judge of the Municipal Court.

The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that during the months of June, July and August the City offices be closed at 12 o'clock noon on every Saturday.

The motion carried.

Mr. Adams of the Daily News appeared before the Council and asked that the order to remove the flag pole at the intersection of Main and Seventh streets be rescinded.

The matter was discussed by the Commissioners, but no action was taken.

On motion of Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
