Grand Junction, Colorado, June 15, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meetings of June 1st and June 8th were read and approved.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

## RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, J. W. Newlin had and express license in 1919, expiring December 31, 1919, but because of sickness he was unable to use the license for the last three months of 1919, and

WHEREAS, he desires to run his express wagon for a short time and until he can sell his business; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the said Newlin be given a license for three months for his express wagon, with the understanding that the license cannot be transferred.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Messrs. Buthorn and Smith appeared before the Council in reference to the drainage of Main street west of Second. After some discussion, the matter was referred to the Commissioner of Highways.

Mr. Friedman and a number of other Main street business men appeared before the Council and asked the passage of a Sunday-closing ordinance.

After some discussion of the matter, it was decided to present the request in the form of a petition to the Council at its next regular meeting. The Mayor reported to the Council that the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Manufacturing Co. is paying no attention to the matter of putting in new globes on Main street and is not doing what it agreed to do in reference to keeping up the White Way.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Manufacturing Co. be notified to appear before the Council at its next regular meeting, June 22, 1920, to take up the question of repairing and replacing broken globes and accessories pertaining to side street lighting on Main street.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.
