

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 22, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 15 were read and approved.

Mr. Anderson, superintendent of the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Manufacturing Co., appeared before the Council and explained why repairs and replacement of globes and accessories pertaining to street side lighting on Main street had not been made, stating that the company had so far been unable to obtain the globes, but that every effort was being made to replace globes as soon as possible.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The committee on band concerts reported that from \$200 to \$250 was available in the Contingent fund for Sunday evening concerts, provided a special city election is not called this year.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
