Grand Junction, Colorado, July 20, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg.

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Highways.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg,

that the City Engineer complete his survey of the so-called "Slipping Hill" and give the number of feet of pipe necessary to enable the City to move its water pipe to the north from the Slipping Hill to the adjoining ridge.

That the Engineer also furnish the description of the new rightof-way necessary to be obtained on the ridge to the north of the Slipping Hill where it is desired to place the pipe.

That the Engineer give further a description of the land which it is deemed necessary should be kept free from irrigation water in the future in order to protect the City's water main.

That the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies get the best figure obtainable for the pipe necessary, and that an order be entered for the same to be delivered at the earliest possible date.

That the Mayor and the City Attorney get the necessary right-ofway on which the pipe will be laid as determined by the Engineer and that the City Attorney shall prepare a contract to be entered into with the owner of the land which is found necessary to be kept free from irrigation in order to protect the city water main, and that the Mayor and the City Attorney take up with the owner the matter of the owner's signing the contract.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The petition of W. H. Hammontree and other City employees, asking for an increase in wages from \$3.50 per day to \$4.00 per day, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Garber, the petition was laid on the table until next regular meeting.
