

Grand Junction, Colorado, July 27, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg.

The minutes of the regular meetings of July 6 and 13 were read and approved.

The petition of C. W. Hayes and others in reference to the dumping of trash at Second and Belford was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Garber, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty.

The quarterly report of the City Clerk and Auditor was submitted and read and referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The petition of city employees for increase in wages was taken up and discussed, but no action was taken thereon.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the Chief of Police be ordered to notify all dealers in the city not to purchase any air rifles or BB guns after this date, and that the police of the city be ordered to stop the use of any such rifles or guns within the city limits.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the council.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the Council adjourned.
