

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 17, 1920.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 10th were read and approved.

A. B. Hawkins having purchased the express business of L. Lambertson appeared before the Council and asked that the license issued to the said Labertson be transferred to him.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the express license issued to L. Lambertson be transferred to A. B. Hawkins.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea;

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order 200 feet one- inch red chemical hose and 2 Dietz fire department lanterns.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase five 20-foot lengths of 2 1-2 inch hose coupled and one dozen expansion rings.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Garber, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order 5 gross Forma germ killer for the Health department.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea. All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order a now loose-leaf water ledger for the Water department.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Garber, yea; Whittaker, yea; Blackstone, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The reports of the City Weigher for the months of June and July having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same were accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following reports having been examined and approved by the clerk and auditor and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, the same were on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, accepted and ordered placed on file:

Quarterly Report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty,

Quarterly Report of the Judge of the Municipal Court.

The City Clerk and Auditor submitted a report showing the amount expended to date in the construction of sewer in Sewer Districts Nos. 5 and 6.

On motion of Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The petition of Horace T. DeLong and others, asking that the streets and alleys on the West Side that had been torn up on

account of sewer construction be put in reasonably good condition.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the petition be accepted, and the Commissioner of Water and Sewers and the Commissioner of Highways be instructed to put the streets and alleys on the West side in good, passable shape.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.
