

Grand Junction, Colo. Sept. 7th. 1920.

Commissioners meet in regular session at 4 O'clock P.M. with Mayor Cherrington in the chair. Commissioners present Cherrington, Garber, Blackstone Whittaker, City attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of August 31st. was read and approved.

Mr. Castell being present presented petitions duly signed by all the property owners in Block 149 of the City of Grand Junction requesting the closing of the North & South alley and permitting side track to be placed therein.

The following resolution was read:

Whereas, The Castell Lumber Company and others property owners in blocks 149 and 160 in the City of Grand Junction desire to construct a side track in the North and South alleys in Blocks 149 and 160, and

Whereas, The Castell Lumber Company desires to construct a lumber yard on Lots 11 to 20, inclusive, in Block 149, and desires to close the East and West alley by gates where it passes between Lots 15 and 16 at the East and West ends thereof, respectively, and

Whereas, the said Company desires to build a lumber shed running East and West and occupying a portion of North side of said alley between Lots 15 and 16,

Therefore, be it RESOLVED, that a revocable permit be granted under the provisions of Section 127 of the Charter of the City of Grand Junction, as follows:

1. That the said Castell Lumber Company and the other petitioners be permitted to construct a railroad side track through the North and South alleys in Blocks 149 and 160, crossing South Ave. between the said blocks: that the said crossing be properly planked in the street and the sidewalks be properly relaid where intersected, and also that the intersection of the North and South alley with the East and West alley of Block 149 be planked so that said sidetrack can at all times be easily driven over.

- 2 That the Castell Lumber Company be permitted to occupy a portion of the North part of the alley between Lots 15 and 16 in Block 149, in said City, with a shed; provided, that the grounds so occupied shall not exceed more than ten feet in width, and that they shall maintain an alley at least 20 feet in width running East and West through said property, apart thereof between the East and West alley as now constituted and the remainder being part of Lot 16 of said Block 149; that they be

permitted to install gates at the West end and East end of said alley where it passes through their said grounds, the said gates to be kept open at all times during business hours on business days, the said alley being unobstructed during said times for business traffic.

It was moved by Commissioner Blackstone and seconded by Commissioner Garber that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. Upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington yea, Garber yea? Blackstone yea? Whittaker Yea, All the Commissioners voting yea the motion was declaired carried and the resolution adopted.

The monthly report of the City weigher was read fee the month of August 1920. Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Garber the report be acc accepted and refered to the Mayor, All the Commissioners voting I the motion was carried.
