

Grand Junction, Colorado, November, 3rd. 1920.

The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction was called to order with Mayor Cherrington in the chair, Commissioners present Cherrington, Garber, Blackstone, Whittaker, City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of October 26, and the adjourned meeting of October 29th. was read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker Seconded by Commissioner Blackstone; the City purchas at a cost of \$75.00, the Map and records of the City now owned by Ed. Romberg, for the City property. The motion being put upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington yea, Garber yea, Blackstone yea, Whittaker yea, all the Commissioners voting yea the motion was declared carried.

The report of the City Weigher for the Month of October was read and it was moved by Commissioner Whittaker second by Commissioner Blackstone the report be accepted and referred to the Mayor, the motion carried.

The communication from the State Compensation Ins. Fund was read and the Commissioner of Finance & Supplies was instructed to write the board explaining the matter will have to lay over till the first of the year.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone seconded by Commissioner Whittaker that the City sell the Colt to Dr. Sullivan for \$100.00 the motion being put upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows, Cherrington yea, Blackstone yea, Garber yea, Whittaker yea, all Commissioners voting yea the motion was declared carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting it was moved by Commissioner Cherrington and seconded by Commissioner Whittaker that we adjourn the motion carried and the meeting adjourned.
