

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 16, 1920.

The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, was called to order at 3 O'clock P.M. with mayor Cherrington in the chair, Commissioners present Cherrington, Garber, Blackstone, Whittaker, City Attorney Tupper was present, coming in a little late.

Reading of the minutes of the regular and adjourned meetings of Nov.9-11-13, was read and approved.

RESOLVED Whereas, The Independant Lumber Company is the owner of all of Block eight (8) of Mobley's Subdivision to the City of Grand Junction, except Lots one (1) and two (2) therein, and

Whereas, the said Company desires to close the alley running East and West in said Block and to Construct across or thereon a spur track from the Denver & Rio Grand Railroad, and

Whereas, they also desire to cross with the said track the North and South alley in said Block, and

Whereas, it appears to the City Council that such action by the said Company will not be injurious to the rights of the City or the property owners, or to any of the property owners therein,

Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED? that a revokable permit be and the same is hereby granted to the said Company and its successors and assigns to close with gates or otherwise the said East and West alley and to build a spur track thereon or across the same, or to otherwise use and occupy the said East and West alley, and to across with a spur track the said North and South alley.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone seconded by Commissioner Garber the Resolution as read be adopted, the motion being put upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows Cherrington yea, Garber yea, Blackstone yea, Whittaker yea, all Commissioners voting yea the motion was declared carried.

A communication from J. A. K. Crawford regarding the Sewer assessment on Lots 1 to 12 and 37to 48 in Block 2 Crawford's Sub Division was received and read, Moved by Commissioner Whittaker seconded by Commissioner Blackstone the communication be referred to the Commissioner of Water & Sewers and the City Attorney for investigation Motion carried.

The request from Mr. A. E. Anderson asking permission to erect an electric sign on the front wall of the building at 339 Main St. was read.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker seconded by Commissioner Blackstone that the request be referred to the Mayor for

investigation and upon his recommendation the permit be granted, the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Blackstone seconded by Commissioner Garber the Commissioner of Finance & Supplies be instructed to purchase one Fordson Tractor at the price of \$873.75 the motion being put upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows Cherrington yea, Garber yea, Blackstone yea, Whittaker yea, all the Commissioners voting yea the motion was declared carried.

The Commissioner of Water & Sewers made his report on the proposed connection of the warehouses on South Av. with roof drainage to the Indian school Sewer. His recommendation is that the permit be not granted.
