Therefore BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council does here by go on record as favoring the said change and is willing to Co-operate in bringing about a change Where by the Grand River will be officially known and called the Colorado River.

The Motion being put upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington yea, Blackstone yea, Whittaker yea, all Commissioners present voting yea the motion was declared carried.
