Grand Junction, Colo., Jan. 18, 1921

The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction Colo. was called to order at 3:30 P.M. with Mayor Cherrington in the chair. Commissioners present: Cherrington, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Peck. City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

A petition from the South Side Womans club, requesting cinder walks on Struthers, Kimball, Nolan, and winters Avenue, was read and referred to Commissioner Blackstone. Arc lights were also requested. This matter was turned over to Mayor Cherrington for investigation.

A letter from the Home Loan and Investment Company was read requesting the city to place their insurance with the aforesaid company.

The report of the Highway Department was read, for the fourth quarter. Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded Commissioner Garber that the report be referred to the city Auditor for audit. All the Commissioners voting yea the motion declared carried. The report of the Water and Sewer Department for the fourth quarter was read. Moved by Commissioner Whittaker seconded by Commissioner Blackstone that the report be turned over to the City Auditor for audit. Motion carried. The report of the City Clerk and Auditor for the fourth quarter was read. Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Garber that the report be referred to the City Treasurer for audit. Motion carried. The report of the City Treasurer for the quarter was read. Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, fourth seconded by Commissioner Garber that the report be referred to the City Clerk and Auditor for audit. Motion carried. The reports of the Light, Police, Fire, and Public Library for the fourth quarter were read. Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone that the reports be turned over to the City Auditor for audit. Motion carried. The report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty for the fourth quarter read. Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded Commissioner Garber that the report be turned over to the City Treasurer for audit. Motion carried. The report of the Judge of the Municipal Court for the fourth quarter was read. Moved by Commissioner Peck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone that the report be turned over to the City Auditor for audit. Motion carried.

Fire Chief Hynes reported that a grave fire menace lay in a building situated near the corner of Fourth Street and Ute Avenue. The matter was referred to City Attorney Tupper to see what steps could be taken to rid the City of such undesirable property.

Sealed bids for the collection and disposal of garbage for the year 1921 were opened. Tom Tabner was found to be the lowest and best bidder, he bidding the sum of Sixty-five (65.00) dollars a month. Moved by Commissioner Peck, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone that Tom Tabner be allowed the contract from the year 20th day of Jan. 1921 to the 20th day of Jan. 1922. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows; Cherrington yea, Garber, yea, Whittaker, yea, Blackstone, yea, Peck yea. All commissioners voting yea the motion was declared carried and the contract ordered signed.

A request from the Milne Transfer Co, Was considered, for the hauling of freight for the year 1919. Moved by Commissioner Blackstone, seconded by Commissioner Peck that The Milne Transfer Company be awarded the work.

Motion carried.
