

Grand Junction, Colorado
March 8, 1921

A regular meeting of the City Council convened at 3:30 P.M. with Acting Mayor Garber presiding. The Commissioners present were, Garber, Whittaker, Blackstone, Peck. City Attorney Tupper was present. Commissioner Cherrington was absent.

The minutes of the last regular session were read and approved.

W.P. Harrigan appeared before the Council asking for a permit to build a side track from the Grand Valley Electric Co. tracks to his property in Block 148. The following resolution was introduced in consideration of this matter.

RESOLUTION.

Whereas, W.P. Harrigan is the owner of Lots Twenty-six (26) and Twenty-seven (27) and the South Seventy Five (75) feet of Lots Twenty-eight (28), Twenty-nine (29), Thirty (30), Thirty-one (31), and Thirty-two (32) all in Block One Hundred Forty-eight (148) in the City of Grand Junction, and

Whereas, he wishes to construct thereon a plant for the sale of coal and feed and desires to construct a side track connecting with the track of the Grand River Valley Railway Company, which is adjacent to the said real estate on South Avenue,

Therefore be it resolved, that a permit is hereby given the said Harrigan to build a sidetrack to leave the said railroad track of the said Company on South Avenue, just east of the east intersection on Fifth Street and South Avenue, the said track going thence in a general northeasterly direction terminating on said Lots Twenty-six (26) and Twenty-seven (27); the said Harrigan agreeing to properly plank and otherwise protect the said side track where it is placed on or across the said South Avenue.

Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that the resolution as read; be passed and adopted. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners present voted as follows, Garber, yea, Whittaker, yea, Blackstone, yea, Peck, yea. All the Commissioners present voting yea, the motion was declared carried.

A letter from A.E.Anderson of the Grand Junction Electric Co. which commented favorably on the work that is being done at Lincoln Park was read.

A.D.Smith put in his estimate for reconstructing the N.W. corner of the City Hall. Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Blackstone, that A.D. Smith; be allowed the job of reconstructing the N.W.corner of the City Hall for the sum of

\$142.00. The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners present voted as follows, Garber, yea, Whittaker, yea, Blackstone, yea, Peck, yea. All the Commissioners present voting yea the motion was declared carried.

The question of purchasing lead pipe for use in the City Parks was brought up. Moved by Commissioner Whittaker, second by Commissioner Peck that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be instructed to purchase Two (2) reels of 5/8" double extra strong lead pipe for use in the city parks. The motion being put upon call of roll, the Commissioners present voted as follows, Garber, yea, Whittaker, yea, Blackstone, yea, Peck, yea. All the Commissioners present voting yea the motion was declared carried and the purchase authorized.

Chas. Adams of the Daily News appeared before the Council asking permission to place the city flag pole, now lying idle, in the parking near the News Office. The Commissioners agreed to give him the use of the pole and to furnish a flag for the same. Commissioner Blackstone was appointed to assist Mr. Adams in the placing of the pole.
